Meetings about how people with a learning disability or autism will be included in the plan

	<p>What this is about</p>
	<p>People with a learning disability and autistic people are included as one of the important priorities for the NHS in the next 10 years.</p>
	<p>NHS England is working with Learning Disability England to hold 7 meetings to talk about what needs to be in the plan.</p>
	<p>The ideas for the plan will be based on the work so far and what people have said is important or needs to happen next. The meetings will talk about the work that has happened so far on making health services better, Transforming Care, Learning from deaths reviews (LeDeR) and other important work. We will talk about what has worked and what hasn't, as well as the evidence from research or numbers.</p>
	<p>We will use these to focus on what actions we think should be in the plan to make the difference we need across all NHS services.</p>

	<p>These meetings are for people with lived experience or relevant jobs. We especially hope that these people will come and help work out the important things to be in the plan –</p>
