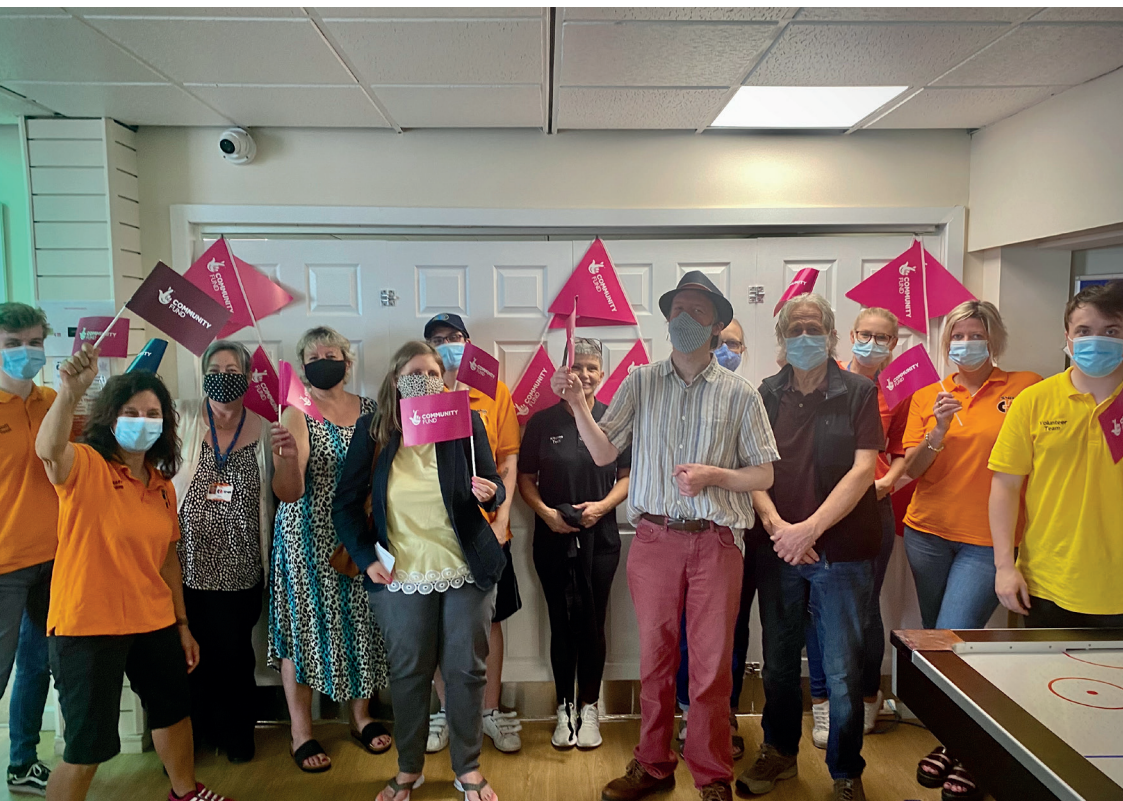
ASC Adult Support
